

GETTING TO CAPRI

The island of Capri can be reached by only private boat or ferry from Naples, Sorrento, Positano, Amalfi, Salerno, or Ischia. The closest airport is Naples-Capodichino International Airport (NAP), but Leonardo da Vinci Rome Fiumicino Airport (FCO) is approximately three hours away by car to the ferry port in Naples. If you're staying on Capri, your hotel can arrange a ferry transfer as well as a taxi service and luggage transfer from the ferry once you arrive on the island.



EXPERIENCE CAPRI FROM THE WATER

A trip to Capri isn't complete without time on the water, where visitors can take in the iconic views of the Faraglioni, visit the Blue Grotto that was rediscovered in 1826, or check out the beach clubs that are renowned for their brightly colored umbrellas.
